

Brenda Vollman is a Doctoral candidate in the Criminal Justice Program of the Graduate Center and an appointed board member of the Center for Lesbian and Gay Studies (CLAGS) at CUNY's Graduate Center. Brenda has earned a Bachelor of Arts in Gender Studies, with a concentration in the African Diaspora, from the Ohio State University (1995). S/he moved to New York City to attend City College, receiving a Masters in Sociology (2000).
