



## The CUNY Pipeline Program – 2009 2010 Applications

Kindly pass this information to students who you feel are qualified and will benefit from the CUNY Pipeline Program.

The CUNY Pipeline Program is a one and one-half year undergraduate program designed to provide educational and financial support for undergraduates interested in pursuing the Ph.D. Students are recruited from the CUNY senior campuses during their junior year.

### **The Program:**

Students selected for the program attend full-time summer workshop at the Graduate Center between their junior and senior years. The program gives academically talented students the opportunity to do challenging work in their own fields. They receive instruction and mentoring from dedicated experts in an intensive, yet supportive environment along with undergraduates from other CUNY campuses who have similar interests and career goals. They also receive help preparing college applications, learn how to apply for fellowships, and receive instruction on preparing for the Graduate Record Exams (GRE's).

### **Eligibility:**

Applicants must be US citizens or permanent residents; juniors enrolled in one of CUNY's senior colleges and expect to have earned 80 credits by the spring semester of their junior year and must be graduating in June 2010. A cumulative GPA of at least 3.2 is required.

### **Stipends:**

Students in the Pipeline program receive stipends totaling \$3,250. This includes \$1,500 for participation in the summer workshop, plus \$750 auxiliary stipend to help cover the cost of graduate school applications, the Graduate Record Exam fee and related expenses. Pipeline students also receive \$1,000 upon completion of the program and submission of the senior thesis.

### **How to apply:**

Applications can be downloaded from the website (<http://web.gc.cuny.edu/oeodp/>) or obtained from our office. The completed application consists of two letters of recommendation from faculty members, an official transcript, and two personal statements. We are accepting applications from November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 until February 1, 2009. The final application deadline is February 1<sup>st</sup>.
