The Office of Educational Opportunity and Diversity Programs offers fellowship support to enrolled and continuing students at The Graduate Center. The Program provides fellowship support for students from groups underrepresented in the professoriate who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents and full-time doctoral matriculants.

OEODP's primary goal is to address simultaneously three critical problems in minority access and achievement in doctoral study:

- Insufficient funding for currently enrolled underrepresented students who are close to achievement of the degree
- Inadequate funding for students at the dissertation level
- Insufficient opportunities for recent graduates to continue their research and gain teaching skills as members of the professoriate

OEODP SPONSORED AWARDS

Continuing students enrolled in a Ph.D. program at The Graduate Center may apply for the following awards:

MAGNET Two-Year Fellowship for students in any of the 32 doctoral programs - Deadline: March 1

J. Bruce Llewellyn One-Year Fellowship in Science, Engineering, Mathematics, Business, and Economics – Deadline: March 1st

All awards are based on academic merit and financial need. To be considered, candidates must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Award renewal is contingent on satisfactory academic progress.
