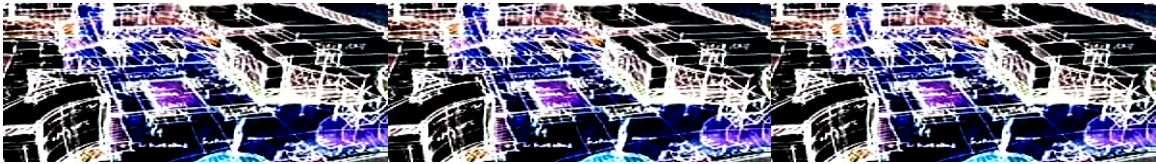

Stephen Graham is co-author of *Cities, War, and Terrorism: Towards an Urban Geopolitics* (Blackwell, 2004) and *Splintering Urbanism: Networked Infrastructures, Technological Mobilities and the Urban Condition* (Routledge, 2001). His research explores the urban implications of new technologies, the importance of mobility and infrastructure in urban life, the links between cities and surveillance, and the relationships between cities, war and terrorism. Professor Graham has won research awards from the Economic and Social Research Council (UK), the Joseph Rowntree Foundation, the United Nations and the British Academy.
